

Start up Dreamweaver CS3.

You will get to a screen which gives you the Open option. We will open up the .html file which was created when you did the File menu, Publish from Flash.

The Dreamweaver File menu, Open dialog will only show you by default the .htm and .html type of files. That is what we want.

Here is what the first dialogue box looks like. You will want to use your own URL, which will be <http://www.uni.edu/yourUNIuserID> as the URL for the files on sunny.uni.edu in your account.

Click the Next button to get to the next dialogue box. Choose "No, I do not want to use Server Technology" and then Click the Next button again.

How would you like to work with your files during development?

Choose Edit local copies on my machine, then upload to server when ready (recommended).

A site, in Adobe Dreamweaver CS3, is a collection of files and folders that corresponds to a website on a server.

What would you like to name your site?

If you want to work directly on the server using FTP or RDS, you should [create an FTP or RDS server connection](#). Working directly on the server does not allow you to perform sitewide operations like link checking or site reports.

Now you will be in the most important part of the Site Definition. Look at the following dialogue box very carefully. You must choose FTP. You must have both checkboxes checked.

Use Secure FTP (sftp) checkbox must be checked.

The Save checkbox next to "What is your FTP password?" must also be checked.

You will set 6 different things. I always try the Test Connection button to ensure that I have done everything correctly. As you can see, you just leave the "What folder on the server would you like to store your files in?" textbox field blank.
